VISIT TO QUEEN ELIZABETH II ARMY MEMORIAL MUSEUM 13-14 Oct 79:

As the Museum has no Gunner on its staff, and having joined as an Associate Member at its inception, I offered to assist the Director at that time in any artillery matters. My offer was accepted, I have been asked for advice and information on a number of occasions, and my efforts are appreciated.

During the October visit I was accompanied by Terry who has similarly offered his services also.

I say this not to blow my own trumpet as it were, but in the hope others of you will follow our example.

No establishment is more worthy of support than the Museum, for now we have a repository where artefacts depicting our history will survive for all time, not be buried, sold for scrap, or merely allowed to rot, as so often happened in the past. The Director still seeks photographs, books, equipment etc pertaining to all Arms of the Service, and we and RF of other Corps are the people most qualified to help him. Photographs need not be donated outright - Museum Staff will make copies and return the originals to the owner if desired.

For 10 dollars you may become an Associate Member; you and your immediate family may then visit the Museum as often as you like for the rest of your lives. At the same your money will provide much-needed funds for new displays, research, expansion etc.

VISIT TO WAIOURU COMMAND WOS AND SGTs MESS 13-14 Oct 79:

During the week-end we were in Waiouru Terry and I enjoyed the privilege of an evening in the Mess as the guests of WOl Bob Wirihana, now Master Gunner at the School. We were pleasantly surprised to be accor ded VIP treatment and spent a most convivial and enjoyable evening. Everything we heard and saw impressed us, especially evidence of members' involvement in local welfare projects which cannot but significantly enhance the Army's image in the eyes of the civilian population, so necessary in times of peace.

ARMY MEMORIAL GATEWAY NARROW NECK:

Following an accident to one of the gateposts and the destruction of its decorative piece, an old copper lantern from the original Fort Cautley, the Navy removed the surviving lantern and placed boats' anchors on both gateposts instead. Thus an Army Memorial now has a totally naval aspect.

The Executive who too often have seen the Army treated in Cinderella fashion view the matter with some concern. We have

therefore written to the Minister of Defence asking that the Army character of the gateway be restored. To date we still await a reply.

MEMBERS IN THE NEWS:

For those who do not receive the RSA Review in the June edition appeared a photograph of a well-known Past President of our Association receiving a Merit Badge and Certificate of Merit from the Dominion President NZRSA who paid tribute to his sterling record in the fields of pensions and welfare. I refer of course to Jack Baigent; on behalf of the Association I therefore tender our sincere congratulations.

Recently the King and Queen of Tonga visited New Zealand to open and dedicate the United Church of Tonga Building in Auckland at which the Rev Vaka Tuitopou officiates. In 1941 the Rev Vaka was a Corporal in Div Sigs attached to 1 Hy Bty Tonga Defence Force the guns of which were then being mounted by an RNZA Detachment of which one of our Executive, Alf Smith, was a member. On learning Alf was living in Auckland and in appreciation of their wartime association the Rev Vaka arranged for Alf and Mrs Smith to be invited to the ceremony at which they were both presented to Their Majesties. Once again congratulations are in order.
