1. LAST POST -- ROLL OF HONOUR 8:

Following a suggestion by our President at A.G.M. this year; whereever a Member "passes on" - a short "Obituary" - no, not Obituary but "Appreciation" - following the _pastice of the Royal Regiment UK, in its monthly Publication, "Gunner". They are better written than I can achieve and do appreciate what those Gunners have done in their dedication to the Regiment.

Since last Newsletter, 34, (Aug '80) we regret the passing of two Old Comrades:

Brig.R.S.PARK, CB.CBE, at Auckland on 15 Aug '80.

The Funeral Service was conducted with full Military Honours at St, David's Presbyterian Church, Khyber Pass Rd. in Auckland, and attended by a large group of our Members — the eulogy being read from the pulpit by Brig. G.P.Cade, DSO.OBE.

Brig Park was one of our most distinguished Members, whose close and infinitely interested association with the Regiment extended from his Graduation from Duntroon in 1916, whence he went immediately to France. Between the Wars for 20 yrs he held numerous Staff and Regimental appointments, and from Fort Dorset in July 1939 was posted to Head NZDLS in London, where he remained throughout "the Blitz" and WW.II., paying two visits to the Middle East during this time. His greatest regret was that he was not given the opportunity of Command in action during WW.II., however, from OC.NMD. in 1950, he was posted to Commander, NZ.Forces, Korea; returning and Retirming in 1953.

His career therefore spanned from Entry Duntroon in 1914, until 1953 - 39 years in uniform, and always intimately connected with the Guns -- No, it was even longer than that, as from late 1950's until early 1960's he was Colonel Commandent RNZA.

Major C.A.BAIGENT, at Mt.Maunganui on 26 Sep '80.

Cyril enlisted in the Regiment in 1938 in 14-Wing, and after Serving in Auckland, (Narrow Neck and North Head), was posted overseas with 14 LAA Regt in Apr.1941 - later transferring to 5 Fd Regt, in which he Served, North Africa and Italy until the end of the War. Post-1945 he transferred and was Commissioned in HNZAOC. After appointments in CMD and SMD, he retired to Picton. His second retirement move to Mt.Maunganui, following his favourite game, golf, where he died from a heart attack during a game on the Course. We greatly regret his passing.
